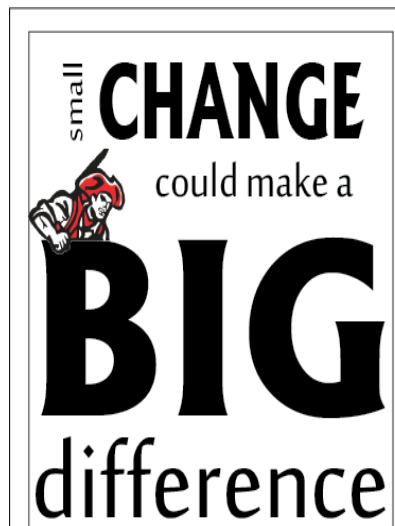

Curriculum

The academic program is organized on an eight hour class schedule. Four credits semester is the maximum course load; students take seven 44 minute classes, and one 35 minute study skills class and a 35 minute lunch.

Bunker Hill High School does not offer Honors or AP classes. GPA is on an unweighted scale.

The Dual Credit and Second Semester Senior Program allows students to enroll in courses and earn college credits at the local community college.

Grade Point Average

GPA is computed using the above quality points. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 28 credits is required for graduation. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed in January and May.

Graduation Requirements:

Twenty Eight(28) credits will be required for each students. Required courses and the number of credits needed are as follows:

Required Courses: Eighteen and one-half(18 1/2)

Computers	One credit-Computer Concepts
Consumer Education	One-half credit-Business Tech
Drivers Education	One-half credit
English	Four credits-1/2 must be Speech
Health	One Semester
Math	Three credits-Required: Algebra and a geometry course
Physical Education	Four years
Science	Three Credits
Social Studies	Two credits-one must be U.S. History. The U.S. and Illinois Constitution must be taken and passed during this class.

Electives: Nine and one-half (9 1/2) credits-One year of music, foreign language or vocational education is required.
